Dr. Brown's clinical practice and research have focused on therapeutic development in gastrointestinal malignancies. His professional and academic interests include healthcare administration and policy, as well as international healthcare delivery systems. Dr. Brown serves on numerous boards, to include: State of Washington Cancer Research Endowment (CARE) Authority; Institute for Systems Biology; P4 Medicine Institute; American Cancer Society Great West Division; The Marsha Rivkin Center for Ovarian Cancer Research; and the Susan G.
