Guest Speakers

For the 2014 Conference, we are pleased to announce three keynote speakers. Our ACS speaker is **Carlos A. Pellegrini, MD, FACS, FRCSI (Hon.)**. Dr. Pellegrini is the ACS President and Henry N. Harkins Professor and Chair, Department of Surgery, University of Washington. Dr. Pellegrini is an esteemed world leader in the field of minimally invasive gastro-intestinal surgery. Dr. Pellegrini led the way in the use of videoendoscopy for the surgical treatment of gastroesophageal reflux disease and developed the initial techniques for the minimally invasive treatment of esophageal motility disorders.

Our cancer speaker is **Mira Milas, M.D., FACS**. At the OHSU Knight Cancer Institute, Dr. Milas has recently joined the multidisciplinary oncology team, providing a full range of diagnosis and treatment services to patients with endocrine tumors, especially thyroid cancer. She serves as Director of Endocrine Surgery and member of the multidisciplinary Thyroid and Parathyroid Center. Her expertise also includes benign thyroid and parathyroid tumors, such as nodular thyroid disease and goiters, and hyperparathyroidism that can lead to kidney stones and significant osteoporosis. Dr. Milas' research interests focus on molecular markers for thyroid cancer diagnosis, circulating cancer

cells, hereditary thyroid cancer syndromes and novel phenotypes of parathyroid disease.

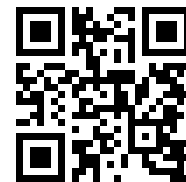

HENRY N. HARKINS

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Born in Montana in 1905, Henry Harkins spent most of his youth in Chicago, where he earned his medical degree from Rush Medical College in 1930. He subsequently received his surgical training at the University of Chicago, serving as Chief Resident in 1936. Following residency, Dr. Harkins began an active career in academic surgery, including fellowships in several European centers. Upon his return to the United States, he served on the staff of Henry Ford Hospital, and later at Johns Hopkins.



In 1947, Dr. Harkins became Chairman of the Department of Surgery at the University of Washington. Under his leadership, the Department gained a reputation for excellence that endures to this day.

Among his many contributions to surgery were work on traumatic shock, burns, hernia, varicose veins and a keen interest in gastric pathophysiology and surgery. Until his death in 1967, he remained active on numerous editorial boards and advisory panels. The Harkins Resident Paper Competition is a fitting tribute to the memory of this extraordinary surgical leader.
