Dr. Potts grew up in Yale, Oklahoma and attended high school in Stillwater, Oklahoma. He attended Oklahoma State University on a track scholarship and graduated with Honors in History. He graduated from the University of Oklahoma Medical School. His surgical residency was at OU under the direction of Rainey Williams. During residency, he did a laboratory fellowship directed by Frank Moody at the University of Utah. Following residency, he did a fellowship in portal hypertension surgery at Emory with Dean Warren.

His first faculty appointment was at Vanderbilt during the chairmanship of John Sawyers. He joined the faculty of the University of Texas Medical School – Houston in 1991. There, he served as Program Director in Surgery for 21 years, Chair of the Graduate Medical Education Committee for 16 years, Assistant Dean for GME for ten years and as Designated Institutional Official.

In 2012, he became the Senior Vice-President for Surgical Accreditation at the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. In that role he has oversight over the accreditation of the programs in the ten surgical specialties and 23 surgical subspecialties which are accredited by that organization.
